#### Saint Patrick's Day (St. Patrick's day)

March 17th-Ireland

## Entertainment Interview



Daniel Jacob Radcliffe (Hammersmith, July 23, 1989) [1] is a British actor, renowned for playing Harry Potter in the films of the same name series written by J. K. Rowling. He made his first professional appearance at the age of ten in the BBC One TV film *David Copperfield* (1999), followed by his first appearance in the cinema for the film *The Tailor of Panama* (2001). At age 11, he starred in the first Harry Potter film. For its work in the series, it won diverse prizes and it invoiced more than 54 million of pounds sterling.

Q - His next role is in Martin McDonagh's play, *The Cripple of Inishmaan*. What made him want to play Billy, the cripple of the show?

A - Michael Grandage, the director, showed me three or four plays, and the moment I read "Cripple" I had no doubts. I am basically the tragic highlight of this piece; Billy has some funny lines, but most of the comedy comes from people being ruthlessly ruthless with him. Which I really like a lot.

I learned that I appreciate the violence on the stage. I was lucky enough to spend many of my breaks as a kid, choreographing fight scenes in Harry Potter. So I'm pretty good at it, the stunt department always said I was racking.

Q - You are a fan of the band British Sea Power, and in 2009 they made a

soundtrack for *Men Of Iron*. Did you ever hear that version?

A - Yes, I watched, think the first 10 minutes with the album. I commented this with Michael Grandage, hoping that I could get to know British Sea Power, that he being the band to make our track.

Q - Is it true that you wanted to get a tattoo with some lyrics from British Sea Power?

A - Yes, from "Bovvny Bivvny Eccc". I want to have a tattoo on my forearm, one on my chest and maybe one on my back. There are many quotes that I love. That sounds pretentious, but this quote from Samuel Beckett: "I've always tried. Always failed. Does not matter. I try again. I fail again. I fail better."

Q - But you do not have any tattoos yet?

A - No, I need to keep a series of jobs where I do not need to be understood, but I have not gotten it yet, for some reason. He had the first years of my career, when I was only in Harry Potter and did not have much nudity. But since then, you've had that in almost all of my work. I recently had the gay sex scene in *Kill Your Darlings*, a pool scene in *The F Word* and a straight-up sex scene in *Hans*. It's been a busy year.

Q - What do you like about Samuel Beckett's citation about failure? The Harry Potter films made billions and *The Woman in Black* and the *A Young Doctor's Notebook* series were both a success...

A - I know it sounds like I've had no flows in my career, but there are things I consider flowed when I look at certain performances and I think, "That's not good enough."

Q - Can you tell which ones?

A - Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince - I do not like my performance in this movie. There are things in *The Woman in Black*. I'm very happy that it went well, but I look at this movie and it was probably six weeks between finishing Potter and getting that, so I heard the scene voice and I see a very similar style of acting.

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## CHOCOLATE CHIP COOKIES



### Recipe:

- 1 cup (2 sticks) ( 200 grams )  
unsalted butter, room temperature
- 3/4 cup ( 150 grams ) granulated  
white sugar
- 3/4 cup ( 160 grams ) firmly packed  
light brown sugar
- 2 large eggs
- 1 1/2 teaspoons pure vanilla extract
- 2 1/4 cups ( 295 grams ) all-  
purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 cups ( 270 grams ) semisweet  
chocolate chips
- 1 cup ( 100 grams ) walnuts or  
pecans, coarsely chopped (optional)



Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C) with rack in center of oven. Line two baking sheets with parchment paper. Set aside.

In the bowl of your electric mixer (or with a hand mixer), cream the butter. Add the white and brown sugars and beat until fluffy (about 2 minutes). Beat in eggs, one at a time, making sure to beat well after each addition. Add the vanilla and beat until incorporated.

In a separate bowl, combine flour, baking soda, and salt. Add the dry ingredients to the egg mixture and beat until incorporated, adding the chocolate chips and nuts (if using) about half way through mixing. If you find the dough very soft, cover and refrigerate until firm (about 30 minutes).

For large cookies, use about a 2 tablespoon ice cream scoop or with two spoons, drop about 2 tablespoons of dough ( 35 grams ) onto the prepared baking sheets. Bake about 12 - 14 minutes, or until golden brown around the edges. Cool completely on wire rack.

Makes about 4 dozen - 3 inch round cookies.

**Note:** You can freeze this dough. Form the dough into balls and place on a parchment lined baking sheet. Freeze and then place the balls of dough in a plastic bag, seal, and freeze. When baking, simply place the frozen balls of dough on a baking sheet and bake as directed - may have to increase baking time a few minutes.

## BISCOITOS COM GOTAS DE CHOCOLATE



### Vocabulário

Teaspoons: colher de chá

Cup: xícara.

unsalted butter: manteiga sem sal.

Room temperature: temperatura ambiente.

White sugar: açúcar branco

Brown sugar: açúcar mascavo.

Large eggs: ovos grandes

Vanilla extract: extrato de baunilha.

Flour: farinha de trigo

Baking soda: fermento em pó

Semi-sweet chocolate chips: chocolate ao leite em gotas de chocolate ou barra (não muito doce)-opcional

Walnuts or pecans: tipo de noz(opcional)

Tablespoon: colher de sopa.



### Modo de fazer adaptado

A colher de chá pode ser substituída por uma colher de sopa rasa.

Aquecer o forno previamente.

Em uma recipiente misturar o açúcar branco, mascavo, a manteiga, o ovo e a baunilha. (misturar com as mãos).

Em outro recipiente coloque a farinha, o fermento e o sal. Adicione a mistura do outro recipiente e acrescente o chocolate.

Se quiser uma massa mais mole, cubra e espere uns 30 minutos até a massa ficar mais firme. Você pode adicionar nozes, ovo de chocolate branco, se quiser.

Modele os cookies com uma colher, se preferir uma massa mais grossa, use duas colheres de massa.

Leve ao forno e coze durante 12 a 14 minutos ou até a massa dourar.

A receita original pede que unte o forno com papel manteiga, mas não é necessário untar o forno.

Se quiser congelar, faça bolinhas de massa e leve ao congelador.
