Origin: The origin of the Pug as a breed probably began in ancient China. Dogs known as "Short Mouthed dogs" or dogs' mouth short ", are described in writings dating from about 700 BC and were probably the precursors of the Pug breed. In the year 1 AD references existed in Chinese documents, the dog "Father", referring to a small dog, a short snout and legs. The Emperor Kang Hsi, in AD 950, produced a dictionary of all the Chinese characters, and it's two references that could describe the Pug: "dogs with short legs" and "a dog with a short head."

Character: Pugs are not French Bulldogs with floppy ears and are not mini or mini Bullmastiffs Mastiffs, as may seem at first glance. Also bear no relation to the Shar-Pei. The closest race of a Pug is the Pekingese, which presents a common origin and history very similar.



Temperament: Quite faithful to the owner, it is easily one inseparable companion. Actually, it follows you everywhere even uninvited. The Pug shows up extremely sociable and quickly fits and adapts to environments and strangers. It is considered one of the most docile breeds.

Care: Like any dog should be fed only with good quality feed (preferably "super-premium"), and always have fresh clean water available. One should avoid, always, sweet, spicy and fatty foods too. Many are prone to obesity, then one should limit the amount of feed that, for adults, should be offered twice daily. A pot with clean, fresh water should always be left to the disposition of the dog. It is important to remember: Chocolate is poison to dogs considered as harm the liver.



Origin: Many people do not know, but the Shih-Tzu is a breed originating in China, which emerged through a mating of a Pekingese and a Lhasa-Apso. These are the similarities that both have three dogs physically. The Shih-Tzu has Pekingese nose and a bit of body-Lhasa Apso. For this many people is whether Lhasa or Shih-Tzu.

Character: Joyful, playful and very active, this fun companion dog can also become an excellent guard dog. The Shih Tzu adapts easily to life in the big cities, but need daily walks. Regular brushing is essential to avoid later having to untangle the knots, which can be painful both for the animal and for its owner.



Comportamento and temperament:

- The Shih Tzu loves to receive affection from its owner.
- They are docile and loving.
- They fit well in small environments such as apartments.
- When trained to physiological needs, they become very hygienic. Do not sleep on sites used for your needs.
- They love getting sprawled on floor tile.
- Drink plenty of water.

Care: Shih Tzu's eyes are prominent, besides being exposed to by many around. It is important to keep your eyes clean and you can use a moist tissue to clean this area. As they have little muzzle careful when walking on the street with him, so that spikes do not come into your eyes. Also, beware of corners and other furniture in your home. It is important to brush your Shih Tzu every day, which lasts on average 15 minutes (consider this if you do not have time or do not like this activity before purchasing a Shih Tzu).
